School vision	To lead Special Education through exemplary and innovative practice.
School values	Merriang School will challenge, engage and empower students. They will achieve their personal best through meaningful educational experiences and a whole school approach based on current research. progressive practices and partnerships with the wider community.
Context challenges	The school currently has two campuses, our secondary campus in Lalor and a primary campus in South Morang. In 2023 the school will have a third site with two WISC classrooms being based within the Barrawang Primary School. A challenge is to ensure all campuses remain as one community, however are reflective of the differentiated needs of each site.  All students within Merriang School have a diagnosed moderate to severe cognitive impairment and require an individual education plan.  We have a high EAL community from varied cultural backgrounds, including migrants and transient VISA holders.  The introduction of individual AAC devices to support student communication and the parent portal supported communication system presents challenges to many of our families.
Intent, rationale and focus	Communication and literacy are essential to students at Merriang School for the development of independent living skills, critical for their success as valued participants within their community. A priority at Merriang School is developing students' social awareness and self-regulation to support them to contribute and build relationships. The school will continue to embed the school wide positive behaviour framework and zones of regulation to develop these skills and attributes. The intended outcome for each student at Merriang School is to ensure they have a viable, post schooling pathway. The school will continue to expand the range of community partnerships with which to engage student, aimed at further extending these opportunities to provide greater options for students.
